of a UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR**

**in the research and faculty staff member group**

of the Faculty of Physics, Astronomy and Applied Computer Science

**in academic discipline: Physical Sciences**

**in experimental research directly connected to at least one of the following areas:**

**(i) nanostructured materials, (ii) materials in energy production and storage, (iii) materials in biotechnology and  
medicine**

The competition is open to candidates who meet the requirements specified in Art. 113 and Art. 116(2)(2) of the Act of 20<sup>th</sup> July 2018: Law on Higher Education and Science and, in accordance with § 163 of the JU Charter, the following eligibility criteria:

- 1) A doctoral degree or higher academic qualifications;
- 2) A record of significant and original achievements in academic, professional, or artistic work;
- 3) A record of significant achievements in organisational work;
- 4) A record of achievements in teaching – this requirement does not apply to candidates for positions in the category of research staff.

Additional criteria:

- the academic degree should be awarded at an institution other than the Jagiellonian University
- the academic achievements should be confirmed by a publication record in renowned journals.

An ideal candidate should:

- actively take part in academic life, in particular by presenting their research at international conferences and symposia,
- have a track record of interdisciplinary scientific research or cooperation with socio-economic environment,
- have organisational experience, in particular a track record of participating in or obtaining external, competitive research funding,
- participate in an ongoing academic collaboration with leading research institutions,
- have experience in popularising their research or innovative education,
- have excellent written and oral communication skills in English.

The post holder (subject to evaluation after 36 months) is required to:

- publish articles in which JU is the only Polish affiliation in leading journals,
- receive at least one external Polish or international grant affiliated at JU within 36 months,
- deliver 60 hours of teaching per academic year during 5 year period (after this period: according to *Work Regulations of the JU*).

Jagiellonian University offers a full-time salary comprising base remuneration and pay enhancement granted for 5 years. Moreover, a successful candidate is awarded a research grant for the duration of 5 years.

Due to the experimental nature of the offered position, before submitting the application, the candidate should contact the Dean of the Faculty of Physics, Astronomy and Applied Computer Science to determine the research topic and related laboratory requirements that the Institute of Physics of the Jagiellonian University can offer.

The candidates who would like to take part in the competitive selection process should send the following documents to the email address ([wydzial.fais@uj.edu.pl](mailto:wydzial.fais@uj.edu.pl)):

1. application form;
2. resume including: publication list, list of awards and distinctions, list of internships and stays at academic institutions; list of concluded and ongoing research projects (where the candidate was/is a Principal Investigator or Co-investigator), with their funding sources;
3. self-presentation statement presenting the candidate's most important achievements and research plans;
4. candidate's personal questionnaire
5. copy of the candidate's doctoral diploma or *habilitation* diploma;

6. information on the candidate's scientific, teaching and organisational achievements;
7. list of publications (specifying the publisher and number of pages);
8. information concerning the academic courses taught by the candidate, if any;
9. reviews of the doctoral or *habilitation* dissertation, if available;
10. the most recent performance evaluation form, if the candidate was subject to such evaluation;
11. candidate's declaration that the Jagiellonian University will be their primary place of work, should they be selected in the competitive selection process;
12. declaration under Article 113 of the Law on Higher Education and Science;
13. declaration on acknowledging and accepting the JU rules and regulations concerning intellectual property and commercialisation;
14. information on personal data processing.

**Application deadline: 31.01.2021.**

The competitive selection process will be concluded by 15.02.2021.
